

Partnering to Meet Community Needs



HDC MidAtlantic and Washington Place Equities are working alongside one another on a \$100 million investment in Lancaster, PA to transform the former UPMC/St. Joseph's hospital campus into a mixed-use, mixed-income development, offering a diverse range of residential, retail and commercial options to meet the needs of the community. This includes approximately 150-175 market-rate and 120-130 affordable housing apartments as well as retail space for local businesses.

HDC is proud to partner with **Steinman Foundation** and **United Disabilities Services Foundation** on Phase One of the Apartments at College Avenue, and work with **Milagro House** to expand transitional living suites for women and children as part of the St. Joseph's Hospital Delp Wing renovation in Phase Two. HDC also collaborated with **Lancaster Lebanon Habitat for Humanity** to bring affordable homeownership opportunities to a site at 913 Wheatland Avenue, which was initially planned to be a phase of HDC's redevelopment. These partnerships leverage our collective strengths to meet housing needs from homelessness to homeownership in Lancaster's West End neighborhood.




Certification in Excellence



Residents are at the core of HDC's mission. Our Resident Services team uses a trauma-informed lens to connect residents to services and programs in their communities so that they can reach their full potential. We are thrilled that our expertise in this field has been recognized through CORES (Certified Organization for Resident Engagement and Services) Certification from the Stewards of Affordable Housing for the Future in 2022. This certification highlights affordable housing owners that have developed a deep commitment, capacity, and competency in providing resident services coordination in affordable rental homes.

Resident voices are critical in achieving our mission. We seek to put resident experiences at the center of everything we do.



HDC works to advance equity by ensuring that those who are impacted by decisions have a seat at the decision-making table. This year, we set that table by launching the **Resident Advisory Council** to provide opportunities for resident engagement and information sharing with HDC's Board of Directors. This Council is made up of 15 residents from across HDC's footprint and is led by HDC Board Member and resident Edwin Martinez Feliciano.

Affecting Change

Now in its third year, HDC's **Resident Academy of Leadership** and Inspiration (RALI) is an initiative that supports residents in building leadership skills, and working together to improve their communities. Residents from three communities in Berks, Dauphin, and Northampton counties in Pennsylvania participated in 2022.

We are committed to opening doors for residents to actively participate in the democratic process and speak out on issues important to them and their communities. As part of HDC's advocacy work, **35 voter registration drives** were hosted at **17 communities** in Berks, Chester, and Lancaster counties in partnership with League of Women Voters, YWCA, Lancaster Votes, Nonprofit VOTES, and Our Home Our Votes.



Supplier Diversity

With over \$26 million invested in more than 550 vendors across HDC's footprint, we understand the impact our decisions can make in generating economic opportunity in the communities we serve. **HDC's Supplier Diversity Program** ensures that we are contracting with businesses that align with our values and demonstrate their commitment to diversity and inclusion.

By 2025, our goal is that 75% of HDC's discretionary spending supports local businesses, and 25% of our discretionary spending supports minority, women, and/or special designation businesses in construction, real estate development, property management, and corporate expenditures.
